D. CONSENT CALENDAR

These items include routine, non-controversial matters and will be acted upon by the Board by one, roll-call motion. D.1. Behavioral Health Services - Approve an agreement with Empire Recovery Center to provide residential and/or recovery services in conformity with the requirements of the Department of Healthcare Services (DHCS) Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Programs.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$98,000 per fiscal year from SUD Funding.

D.2. Behavioral Health Services - Approve an agreement with Environmental

Alternatives, dba EA Family Services to provide Mental Health Treatment Services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) children and youth who are Trinity County Medi-Cal members.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$50,000 from Behavioral Health Funding.

- D.3. Behavioral Health Services - Approve an agreement with Vista Pacifica Enterprises, INC. to provide residential long-term care and rehabilitation services to Trinity County members.

No impact to the General Fund, up to \$150,000 per FY from BHS Funding.

- D.4. Behavioral Health Services - Approve a budget adjustment for FY 23/24 for Realignment: Mental Health - Dept. 9494 increasing Transfers Out by \$14,437; and approve a budget adjustment for FY 23/24 for Mental Health Services Act - Dept. 8570 decreasing Transfers Out by \$14,437.

No impact to the General Fund; current cash balance in Realignment: Mental Health - Fund 494 is \$0 and in Mental Health Services Act - Fund 570 is \$3,392,262.95

- D.5. Clerk-Recorder/Assessor/ Elections - Approve a budget adjustment for FY 23/24 for Elections - Dept. 1650 increasing revenue by \$38,660, Services & Supplies by \$19,596 and Fixed Assets by \$19,064.

Increase in General Fund appropriations in the amount of \$38,660.

- D.6. Clerk of the Board - Find no objection to the issuance of a daily alcoholic beverage license to the Weaverville Lions Club to serve alcoholic beverages at their festival to be held at Lowden Park in Weaverville, CA on July 3-7, 2024.

- D.7. - D.9. Health and Human Services- Budget Adjustments - Approve a budget

adjustment for FY 23/24 for Emergency Services - Dept. 2260 increasing revenue by \$53,522 and Services & Supplies by \$121,273 and decreasing Salaries & Benefits by \$459, Interfund Expenses by \$1,300 and Fixed Assets by \$42,850.

No impact to General Fund; current cash balance for Emergency Services - Fund 147 is \$34,412.

- D.10. Probation - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement Human Response Network, increasing the maximum cost by \$50,000 and extending the term to June 30, 2027, to provide transitional housing, associated services, and case management services.

No impact on the General Fund; funding is a part of the approved budget for CCP.

- D.11. Sheriff - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement with Relias, updating subscription fees to provide an online training academy.

\$4594.92 per fiscal year from the Jail budget.

- D.12. Sheriff - Approve a budget adjustment for FY 23/24 for Jail Health - Dept. 2285 increasing Services & Supplies by \$160,000.

No impact to the General Fund; current cash balance in the Sheriff General Fund - Fund 110 is \$1,416,015.83.

Approximate cost in salary and benefits per month at step C is \$24,212.

Fiscal impact unknown.

- F.5. Human Resources - Adopt a Trinity County Human Relations (HR) policy establishing a workplace violence prevention program.
