D. CONSENT CALENDAR

D.1. Board of Supervisors - Authorize the chairman to sign a letter of support for Hmong monument in Hayfork park.

No fiscal impact.

D.2. Board of Supervisors - Authorize the Chairman to sign a comment letter to OSHA regarding proposed 29 CFR 1910.155 and 156.

No fiscal impact.

D.3. Child Support Services - Approve amendment number 7 to the agreement with Pacific Process & Legal Services, extending the term date to June 30, 2025, increasing the maximum cost by \$10,000, and updating exhibit B to provide outside process service to serve legal documents in a timely manner.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$85,000 from the Child Support Budget allocated by the State/Federal.

D.4. Clerk of the Board - Appoint John "Chris" Semer to the Trinity County Waterworks District 1 Board of Directors to serve the remaining term of Kenneth Wiley Jr. expiring December 31, 2024.

D.7. Clerk of the Board - Approve the regular meeting minutes of May 7, 21, and June 4, 2024, and the Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission meeting minutes of May 23, 2024 as submitted by the Deputy Clerk.

D.8. Clerk of the Board - Adopt a resolution that celebrates Jimmy Carter's 100th birthday and Proclaims the first week of October as Jimmy Carter Week.

D.9. District Attorney - Approve amendment number 1 to the agreement with the California Department of Justice, allowing their laboratories to commence drug analysis immediately when no alcohol content is suspected, thus bypassing the otherwise-required testing for alcohol. This change will streamline the analytical process, minimize turn-around times, and decrease backlogs when providing DUI analysis services.

Up to \$15,000 annually and service has been and is currently in the DA budget.

D.10. Health and Human Services- Adult Services - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement with JUMP Technology Services, extending the term to June 30, 2027; increasing the maximum cost by \$1,500; to provide In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Provider enrollment, registry, and orientation services via their BOUNDS IHSS Provider Portal to IHSS Public Authority offices.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$27,500 from Public Authority Administrative funding.

D.11. Health and Human Services - CWS - Approve Amendment number 1 to the agreement with the California Department of Social Services to amend Exhibits A and B and add Exhibits A1 and A2 to provide Trinity County with

adoption services.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$101,672 from the Child Welfare Allocation.

- D.12. Health and Human Services - CWS - Approve amendment number 1 to the agreement with EA Family Services, extending the term to June 30, 2027, to provide visitation and supervised visit services and respite care.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$40,000 per fiscal year from Child Welfare Services allocation.

- D.13. Health and Human Services - CWS - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement with Seneca Family of Agencies to extend the term to June 30, 2025 to provide family finding services for Child Welfare Services, Probation, and Adult Protective Services.

No impact to the General Fund; up to \$3,000 from Child Welfare, Probation, and Adult Protective Services allocations.

- D.14. Health and Human Services- Eligibility - Approve an agreement with California Department of Health Care Services for Medi-Cal Privacy and Security Agreement.

No fiscal impact.

- D.15. Health and Human Services - Office of Emergency Services - Approve a resolution appointing a Local Area Advisor for the community of Hettenshaw Valley.

No fiscal impact.

- D.16. Health and Human Services - Public Health - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement with the California Department of Public Health, increasing the contract by \$51,016.89 for 2024/2025 for implementing the "Moving California Oral Health Forward" project.

No fiscal impact; additional potential revenue of \$51,016.89 for Trinity's Local Oral Health Program.

- D.17. Probation - Approve an agreement with Shield Regional Training Center to become a participating member agency that provides training resources.

Up to \$1500 per fiscal year for membership dues in the current Probation budget.

- D.18. Probation - Approve amendment number 1 to the memorandum of understanding with The Superior Court of Trinity County, extending the term until the Pretrial funding is no longer available.

No impact on the general fund, as this is revenue for the Probation Departmental Budget.

- D.19. Probation - Approve amendment number 2 to the agreement with Tehama County Juvenile Detention Facility, increasing the maximum cost by \$100,000 per fiscal year to provide housing, medical care as needed and amend section 3 Compensation.

No impact to the General Fund. Increase the maximum contract amount to cover medical expenses that are paid through the Jail Health/Realignment Funds.

- D.20. Sheriff - Approve a budget for FY 23/24 for Jail Health - Dept 2285 increasing Revenues by \$65,857, and increasing Services & Supplies by \$58,057 and Inter-fund expense by \$7,800.

Authorizes the use of insurance proceeds in the amount of \$65,857 to offset higher than anticipated expenses in the Jail Health budget in FY 23/24.

- D.21. Transportation - Agreement: Airports Lease-(Revision July 2024)

No fiscal impact.

- D.22. Transportation - Approve an agreement with Trinity Tire Factory to provide tire installation, mounting and balancing, servicing, maintenance, repair and road side service, as needed by Trinity County Department of Transportation and Trinity Transit.

Up to \$30,000 per Fiscal year from Road and Transit Funds.

- D.23. Transportation - Ratify the Director of Transportation's signature on Contract Change Order 1 to the agreement with Truesdell Corp of Ca, Inc., increasing the contract by \$19,930 for additional recessed reflectors on the Rush Creek Road High Friction Surface Treatment project.

\$19,930 paid by Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant.

- D.24. Transportation - Take the following actions regarding the Emergency Storm Damage Repair on Ruth-Zenia PM 18.75 County Project No. 24-0258:

A. Adopt the plans and specifications for the CA24-4 storm damage repair Ruth-Zenia PM 18.75, County Project No. 24-0258; and

B. Authorize the Director of Transportation to sign the Notice to Contractors; and

C. Authorize the Department of Transportation to advertise for competitive bids; and

D. Authorize the Director of Transportation to execute a construction contract and related documents with the lowest responsive bidder, provided the

contract amount does not exceed available project funds, reduce scope of work to stay within available funds or to reject all bids; and
E. Authorize the Director of Transportation to approve all construction change orders up to 10% of the bid amount, provided the contract amount does not exceed available funds for the project.

Construction cost is estimated to be approximately \$5,650,000; federal Emergency Response (ER) funds will reimburse 100% of the total cost if construction is completed within 270 days of the declared disaster event.

D.25. Trinity County Transportation Commission - Approve an agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. to provide a feasibility study for Trinity County's Zero Emissions Bus (ZEB).

No impact to General Fund; The agreement will be paid by \$60,000 in Rural Planning Assistance (RPA) Funds and \$60,000 in Local Transportation Funds (LTF).
